The Veterans Administration's PAVE program is intended to prevent or delay amputations for veterans at risk of limb loss. Evidence based help reduce cost and streamline logistics wound care therapeutics proven to heal DFUs more durably are now available. The American Red Cross has a longstanding partnership with the U.S. military to enhance the health and well-being of America's Armed Forces. Five years ago, the Military Training Network (MTN) turned to the Red Cross to help it train and certify servicemembers in basic and advanced life support. This presentation will provide an overview of the Red Cross' development and implementation of these training programs, the process the military health system followed to consider and ultimately adopt them, and highlight the substantial cost and time savings it has realized. Insights gained from the MTN's

success could help the Veterans Health Administration achieve similar, if not greater, efficiency and effectiveness with resuscitation training.
